Matthew 26:26-29

26 While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it[d] he broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." 27 Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, 28 for this is my blood of the[e] covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. 29 I tell you, I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

! Corinthians 11:23-26

23 For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, 24 and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for[f] you. Do this in remembrance of me." 25 In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." 26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

One of the ways to be thankful is to remember Christ's sacrifice for us and gather together around the Lord's table. Why do we gather at Church? We come together to hear God's Word and receive the Sacraments. How can we follow Jesus if we do not come together and know his words? Jesus commands us to come together and receive the Lord's Supper. Why would we not want to receive his gift of his body and blood with the bread and wine in Holy Communion? Jesus promises to be bodily present at the table with the bread and wine and is calling us a community to join with one another. Luther tells us in the Large Catechism, "what manner of Christian am I? Were I a Christian I would always have a least a little longing to do what my Lord commanded me to do." Christ's command should be enough to make us desire Holy Communion. We become cold when we withdraw from the hearing of God's Word in Holy Scriptures, and the sharing together of his gift of Holy Eucharist. We grow cold when we do not confess our sins and hear the words of forgiveness. The church is a gathered community called by the Holy Spirit and that call is open to you each Sunday. The good news is that the Sacrament depends not on our worthiness. We are not baptized or come to Church for confession because we are holy and perfect. We go because we know we are sinners that need God's grace daily. Jesus word's of "This is my body, given for you. This is my blood for the forgiveness of sins given for you" Reflect and include yourself in this word "you" so you will come to the table. Jesus offers us himself for strength and forgiveness. Do not neglect the gift. The gifts of God for the people of God.







One Church Experiment

Similar to what has been happening in the Catholic church for quite some time, the ELCA has noted a decline in the number of students entering seminary schools, which will eventually translate into fewer ordained ministers available to our parishes. Combine this issue with declining church membership and attendance, and it was recognized that we Lutherans needed to "get out in front of this" and look for ways to "do more with less".

The Northeastern Ohio Synod (NEOS) launched a process to quantify the issues we face and identify solutions on how to successfully move forward with our ministries. The process began w/ Project Isaiah 43 in April, and is continuing with the One Church Experiment now under way. Project Isaiah 43: I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you see it? Isaiah 43:19a 6 sessions in April/May, spread out across synod (Bethel hosted a session on 05/04) Café setting, small group conversations between congregations and pastors 700 notes collected re: "Collaboration" theme

One Church Experiment

Developed from the Project Isaiah 43 work with input from the June Synod Assembly Working Hypothesis:

Congregations are being called together in groups of 4-6 to be the Body of Christ together. The Collaborative of congregations has a shared mission and vision within their communities. Served by a staff of at least 2 pastors and potentially a deacon.

What's next?

Assemble committee to evaluate options – 2/3 council members + 2/3 congregation Experiment! Get together w/ near-by parishes to see what is possible
